Grab and Go Student Meals

Grab and Go Student Meals will be provided during school closure. In order to limit large groups of people gathering, meals will be delivered in a new method. Details include:

Meals will be provided daily Monday through Friday, beginning March 16, 2020. Meals will not be provided March 30-April 3 (Spring Break).

Meals will only be available from 9:00am - 11:00am at schools and participating centers.

Meals will include one day of breakfast and lunch provided in one bag.

Meals will be available for pick-up and taken home to eat.

Meals can be picked up by students or their families. Parents/guardians may pick up to 4 meals at a time.

ESL HOUSING AUTHORITY: EMERGENCY CHANGES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OFFICES

To protect the health and safety of residents, staff and the general public due to the recent concerns regarding the Coronavirus (COVID-19) at close of business March 16, 2020 until further notice, the Housing Authority of the City of East St. Louis (ESLHA) management offices will be closed to the public. Staff will be working but all contact should be by telephone and/or email. Until further notice:

- RENT PAYMENTS: Place in the rent box located outside and/or the lobby of the management office where you reside. The rent receipts will be hand delivered and/or sent by first class mail to the resident. The resident may contact the office by telephone to confirm payment receipt. Late fees will be waived until further notice.
- WORK ORDERS: Residents shall continue to call in work orders as needed. Maintenance staff will continue to respond to emergency and routine work orders as needed. If a household member is experiencing any illness, please notify ESLHA at the time the work order is placed or as soon as the illness is detected. If a household member is ill, the work order will be scheduled at a later time. Staff will be wearing protective gear.
- RE-EXAMS/INTERIMS: Management will provide the re-examination/interim packets with instructions in writing to any impacted resident. You are required to return the packets with the required documentation to the rent box located outside and/or the lobby of the management office where the you reside. ESLHA Staff will confirm receipt in writing within 5 business days.
- **WEEKLY EXTERMINATION:** Weekly extermination will continue without interruption unless notified in writing by ESLHA Management or in the event a household member is experiencing any illness.
- BUILDING MAINTENANCE: WILL BE CLEANED/STERILIZED DAILY.

 If a household member is experiencing influenza (flu) and/or respiratory symptoms, or any illness, please notify the management office immediately prior to making any direct contact with ESLHA Staff.

If you have any questions, please contact the Management office immediately. Attached is a factsheet regarding the Coronavirus (COVID-19). ESLHA appreciates your patience and consideration during this time.

ESL CITY HALL

In the interest of health and safety, The East St. Louis Municipal Building will be closed to the general public beginning Wednesday, March 18, 2020 and continuing through April 6, 2020. Staff will continue to work during this time, but guests will not be allowed in the building.

"While we understand this may be an inconvenience to our citizens, we must take the necessary precautions to protect our residents as well as our staff. We are maintaining contact with our community partners to ensure we are adhering to the most up to date guidelines from the CDC. This situation is very fluid and we are encouraging our citizens not to panic," stated Mayor Robert Eastern, III.

City officials made the decision to close to the general public in an attempt prevent the spread of the coronavirus after consulting with community partners and representatives from Governor Pritzker's office. Public Safety officials will continue to respond to emergencies during this time.

EAST SIDE HEALTH DISTRICT MESSAGE

As we continue to feel the increased impact of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) on our community, East Side Health District feels that it is important to share with you steps that we are taking to help keep you, our clients, guests and employees, safe and healthy. Let me reassure you that we have protocols in place that align with our sister agency, St. Clair county Health Department (SCCHD), under guidance from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).

Your health and safety are our number one priority. We consider ourselves to be a part of this great Metro East Community. As such, we are continuing to investigate all possible exposures to COVID-19 in accordance to IDPH and CDC guidelines.

Due to the continued evolving Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, East Side Health District clinics are restricting access to our buildings. No visitors are allowed without an appointment at any clinic, East St. Louis, Cahokia, or Fairmont City. If you are a new client for services, please call 618-874-4713 to set an appointment to be seen. For WIC, STI and Environmental Health clients please follow the attached service summary. If you need death or birth certificates, the Vital Records office is open as usual.

I know that these changes will cause a disruption of your regular way of doing things. It is not our intent to cause you more stress but to keep everyone as safe as possible. As things progress, we may implement additional preventative measures to ensure the well-being of our clients, guests and employees, which may include but not be limited to, staffing or service modifications.

We remain here to serve you to the best of our ability.

All Environmental Health matters will be handled on a case by case basis. There have not been any changes to the Vital Records hours of operation.

WIC POLICY CHANGES DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

All WIC offices are OPEN and will continue to provide services for Women, Infant and Children. The lobby is closed to visitors. Only clients with appointments will be seen.

For all Certifications and Recertifications we are waiving the physical presence requirements for new babies and children.

If your child has been to the doctor recently, please have them fax their health information to the WIC office (618-874-4737)

To make it easier we are offering curbside pick up for all follow-up and pick-up appointments.

Please stay in your car and call 618-874-4713 and we will bring your coupons to you. STD SUSPENSION OF HOME VISIT POLICY

As of March 16, 2020, East Side Health District will restrict all work-related travel for all Ryan White, HIV Prevention and STD staff. All home visits are suspended until further notice unless approved in advance.

If a client must be seen in the clinic, precautions will be taken to protect everyone regarding the COVID-19 virus spread. For STD clinic clients if you present with respiratory symptoms, coughing, sneezing, etc., you will be presented a face mask and asked to wear it to receive services. If the client refuses to comply, they will not receive services and be asked to leave the premises.

By calling and setting an appointment supportive services can be rendered by a curb side option which includes:

- 1. Eligibility Assessment
- 2. Treatment only and health education
- 3. Dispensing of Ryan White Vouchers
